Time to Pray

This past month I've been reading and preparing for our 40 Days of Prayer event for our church during this Lenten Season. Some would say; I know how to pray, I do it every day. One thing I've found over the years; it is easy for our prayer life

to get repetitious. We can all benefit from new perspective and I'm looking forward to that during this study together.

One example of my prayer life being changed was after I read a book by Stormie Omartian, titled, "The Power of a Praying Husband. One particular section talks about and encourages praying for your wife that:

She will know that she is loved by God.

She will sense the beauty of the Lord in herself.

She will feel loved by me.

She will value herself as God values her.

Pray for myself that I will always see how beautiful she is.

I remember praying these prayers for Kathy and I still do today.

I remember another time being challenged by a book I read to pray for a different person or family in the church for a straight week. I didn't select them based on need, but totally random, that meant the prayers for them were largely based on them being drawn closer to God and finding a closer relationship with Jesus Christ.

I remember praying for several people that they always know that they are loved by God. It is ironic that all Christians (new and old) can sometimes forget that they are loved by God.

I would pray that they would always sense the beauty of God in themselves; after all, we are all created in God's image. God sees the beauty He created in us all the time; but I'm not sure we always sense that – even though we should.

I remember back then praying several times for people of the church to see how much their service is of value to others. This sense of value isn't so we can feel good about ourselves, but that we can see how God values us.

I've begun praying for our church; that all of us will have a desire to take part in this time of prayer together. I've been praying that this will be a time of breakthrough; that we will together see God's vision for Community Church moving forward. I'm asking you to pray for these same things as we approach the beginning of 40 Days of Prayer.


