Misfits



This year I was watching, for probably the 150th time (not exaggerating), Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer. Yes, if it is on, I watch it. During the scene that involves the "island of misfit toys" I was struck with the idea that we were all misfits in need of rescue. God knows this and he sent his Son, Jesus, to do just that, to rescue us to Himself.

Like the toys, we have a tendency to want to distance ourselves from misfits. Toys that are broken, missing something, a "train with square wheels," a "Charlie in the Box," a "bird the swims," or a "cowboy who rides and ostrich." Do we also do that with people? Do we avoid such people; do we keep them at a distance? Do we "place them on an island" by themselves?

Just like the toys, we even think of ourselves this way. We sit in church and focus on our flaws rather than our gifts. We think we know what the "perfect Christian" is and we lose sight of what we have to offer.

We think we can't sing – we can't praise God because we don't have perfect pitch - because we don't have a great voice (It doesn't matter - just ask anyone who has heard me sing)...

Have you ever heard; I'm afraid to share my faith because I don't know enough and someone might ask me a question I can't answer, I'm not comfortable speaking in public (Moses anyone), I know I'll make a mistake...

The truth is; we are all broken, we all have our faults and God knows this. God wants us not to be paralyzed by our faults, but to use them to show others the way to Him. Each and every one of us is critical to the functioning body of Christ.

Does it really matter if you don't have a perfect voice (remember scripture – make a "joyful noise" to the Lord – you are not singing a solo), you don't have to know everything to share your faith, just know that Jesus has saved you (if you don't have all the answers – send them my way – they'll quickly learn with you that I have more questions than answers too), as for reading or praying in a group of people (remember who you glorify when you read and when you pray – it's God – ask some of the people in the congregation who read or sing regularly how terrified they used to be).

Drop the misfit feelings and allow God to mold you; allow God to take all your perceived flaws and shortcomings and use them for His glory.



Council of Ministry Meeting Highlights November 2017

From the treasurer:

• YTD Date Income: \$146,583.36.

• YTD Date Expenses: \$133,640.67.

• Income exceeds expenses by \$12,942.69. Yeah!!

• General Fund Balance is \$32,989.56.

From Finance & Personnel: The proposed 2018 budget and Capital Campaign were approved at the congregational meeting on October 8, 2018. The Noisy Coin offering took in \$1,276.14. Usual expenses for the Adopt-a-Family Christmas is \$2,000. The difference of \$723.86 will be made up from the General Fund. A Love Offering for the staff will be collected and due by Sunday, December 17. The annual Christmas Offering taken Christmas Eve will go to support Community Table.

Annual Reports are due December 1, so that Lisa has ample time to prepare the Annual Report. A template for the report is available.

From Worship: Looking ahead to December, decorating the church for Advent is scheduled for Saturday, December 2. There will be a regular worship service on Sunday, December 24 (Christmas Eve Day).

A Lenten study "40 Days of Prayer" by Rick Warren is planned for Lent. More information to follow.
