Bring your own chair, and one to share if you can.





Let's talk worship!

Worship is where we are called to transformation from our self-centeredness (nothing gets in the way of our discernment from God more than self-centeredness) and unify our faith together in Christ. Worship is where we confess and proclaim God, Lord of our life and praise Him for all He has done for us and has promised to do for us.

Worship is recorded in scripture beginning in Genesis 13:18 recording that Abraham (Abram at the time); "Abram moved his tent, and came and settled by the oaks of

Mamre...and there he built an altar to the Lord." These same scriptures tell us that Lot pitched his tent toward Sodom (Genesis 13:12). When we examine these two passages together we see the contrast in their decisions and realize that worship is a free choice. Abram built an altar to the Lord...question - does our life suggest we are building a legacy to Him?

Worship is a personal choice, like faith is a personal choice. As Christians we are called to make worship a priority in our life and worship carries with it implication not only for ourselves, but others we worship with as well. Congregations who are excited about worship and make it a priority in their lives draw people to Jesus and to the local church.

Some portions of worship occur every Sunday, others monthly, and some only on special occasions (holidays) or even one-time events. Houses of worship are as varied as the people who come in response to God's call to worship; from elaborate "high-church" ritual to casual gatherings. Our settings vary widely as well from tents to homes, quaint country churches to ornate cathedrals, vespers on the beach to stadiums seating tens of thousands. In each case though, it is the same personal desire to worship God that drives us to these settings.

Likewise, styles of worship vary greatly as well; each style, like each setting, seeking to convey adoration and praise to God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. All churches generally include periods for praising God, reading the Bible, praying, giving of our tithes and offerings to God, sharing the Lord's Supper, listening to God speak to us is sermon, and offering an invitation to discipleship. These are all elements of worship that continue to form the foundation of most Christian worship services around the world. Some authorities suggest that worship contains two primary elements; the Word and Sacrament or 'God speaks and we respond'. Others describe worship more fully; *Adoration* – praise to God in song, *Thanksgiving* – a reverent expression through prayer and gifts, *Proclamation* of God through scripture and sermon, *Renewal* through the sacrament of communion and baptism, *Fellowship* by participating joyfully with the whole people of God, and *Benediction* where we share the peace and blessing of Christ together.

No matter the style, no matter the order; above all we gather the first day of each week to declare to God and to the world, the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, to Glorify God, and to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord of our lives!

My friends, God's Beloved, I encourage to you read Hebrews 10 and hear the call of God in this passage for us to worship God by offering ourselves to God just as Christ offered himself once and for all as a sacrifice for our sins.

¹⁹ Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. (a portion of scripture from Hebrews 10).

This summer you will have lots of other things that will seek to draw you away from worship. Don't compromise your faith because you have "better things or more important things " to do on Sunday morning. David felt there was nothing more important or enjoyable than worship and Revelation 4 tells us how God values worship. Jesus made it clear how important it is to worship. Going on vacation – take an hour and worship where you are – I always have a wonderful experience visiting a church where I can just focus on the Lord and meet Christian people.
