
Fall Potluck

Wednesday Bible Study

The weekly Wednesday Bible Study has begun! The study is at 7 pm, and meets in Fellowship Hall.

Through the month of October we will focus on the Reformation. 2017 marks the 500th anniversary of the Reformation (marked by the 95 Theses written by Martin Luther). Together we will discuss and explore what shaped the reformation and the impact it has had on the Christian Church universal.

The Reformation

Are you familiar with The Reformation (Protestant Reformation)? I suspect everyone reading this has heard of it and many of you probably know quite a bit about it. Together we'll study the Reformation over the next five Wednesdays beginning on the 27th of September at 7pm.

Simply put, the Reformation was the schism (separation) from the Roman Catholic Church that most people credit to Martin Luther. The birth of the Reformation is commonly noted as being when Martin Luther penned the 95 Theses and nailed it to a door in Wittenberg, Germany in October of 1517. Ironically it was never Luther's intention to cause a separation of the church, but simply to debate the selling of indulgences and stop the practice. There were a variety of factors/events at the time that came together and caused this split to happen; Corruption in the Roman Catholic Church, Immorality in the Church, Lack of Political Leadership in Europe, a significant Theological Debate, the existence of the printing press and a literate laypeople to name a few. We will explore these and other factors over the next month.

Why look at the Reformation, why study it? Because the Reformation asked the questions (& sought Biblical answers): How is one saved for eternity, what is the role of the church in the Kingdom of God, and what truths form the basis of faith lived in Jesus Christ?

There were five basic beliefs or doctrines (5 "Sola's – Greek word for alone") that formed the basis of the Reformation: Sola Gratia – Grace Alone, Sola Fida – Faith Alone, Solus Christus – In Christ Alone, Sola Scriptura – Scripture Alone, and Soli Deo Gloria – For the Glory of God Alone. We will explore these together and my sermons for the month of October will be based on one of these each Sunday.

Our schedule for the next month of Wednesday Bible Studies (beginning at 7pm) will look like this:

- **September 27:** Movie "Luther." This movie will provide a simple introduction to the events of the time and provide a biographic sketch of this 16th century priest who raised the Biblical points that form the foundation of our faith.
- October 4: Reformation History Events and Issues that triggered the Reformation
- October 11: 95 Theses Asking questions about salvation.
- October 18: Theological Topics & Effects of the Reformation on the Modern Church
- October 25: To Be Determined based on our discussions and questions.

I look forward to seeing all of you on Wednesday!

Council of Ministry Meeting Highlights September 20, 2017



From Worship: October will be a busy month. October 1 is World Wide Communion where we celebrate communion with

churches all around the world. October 8 is the Annual Congregation Meeting immediately following worship. The proposed 2018 budget, a capital campaign proposal to repair the air conditioning in the Fellowship, Pastor Brett's and the Secretary's office, and a slate of officers will be presented. Bible study and sermons will most likely focus on Martin Luther, the German theologian and religious reformer who was the catalyst of the 16th-century Protestant Reformation.

From B.U.M. (Building, use and maintenance): Many repairs have been made -- a water leak in the sprinkler system and a hot water line leak. The grass trimmer, a roaster oven, a defective coffee maker, and a timer for the entrance lights have all been replaced. The B.U.M. budget request was approved. And a capital campaign proposal was developed that will be presented in October.

From Membership, Outreach and Evangelism (M.O.E.), Christian Education and Communications:

Pastor Brett will be reaching out to inactive members by phone or letter. A new photo directory is being planned for the Spring. All members are encouraged to attend the Bible study that begins on Wednesday, September 27 with a film about Martin Luther at 7:00 p.m. The month of October's study will focus on Martin Luther and his role in the Protestant Reformation. The Bible study will be held on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m.

From Christian Women's Fellowship (C.W.F.): In the future, coffee hour will be coffee, tea, water and cookies only. C.W.F. will be changing their meeting time to 9:30 am, still on the first Monday of the month. A fall potluck is planned for Wednesday, October 11 at 5:30 pm.

From Finance and Personnel: Staff interviews are being completed. The personnel committee has developed a process for evaluating the pastor which will be reviewed at the October meeting. The General Fund balance shows an excess of \$29,000. The committee will begin meeting on the first Monday of each month at 6:00 p.m. A stewardship letter with the estimate of giving form and midyear statements will be mailed soon.


