Update from Daryl Beltz:

Greetings Friends!

Leshia and I want to thank you for your Prayers, phone calls, cards, and gifts. The outpouring of your love into our lives shows us that God is providing for all things. There is power in prayer, we have been reminded that through God all things are possible. Thank you for being a blessing.

It has been a hard past few weeks, my condition continues to deteriorate slowly. I continue to go for transfusions twice a week. I am now getting chemotherapy as well, I have started five days in a 28 day cycle. I have been tentatively scheduled to get a bone marrow transplant in August. The chemotherapy will continue until then. Just before transplant I will receive a large dosage of chemotherapy to kill off my immune system.

It is not certain yet who my donor will be that will be in God's hands. No match has been found yet, in the absence of a matching donor one of our three children can be half matches. My oncologist has every confidence that either way it will be a successful transplant.

I must say that I am more than ready to face this with so many standing with us in prayer, and God's provision and timing.
