100th Year Anniversary of Community Church From the Congregational Church of Christ, organized July 9th 1870, Register #1, comes an account following the Big Fire of 1881 in Ludington:

"On June 11th 1881, a disastrous Conflagration visited Ludington sweeping away a large part of the business houses together with the Cong'l Church. On the following Sabbath Rev. Russell W. Keyes preached for us in the Presbyterian Chapel, that Society generously offering us their house of worship. After hearing Bro. Keyes ... the Society extended him a call at \$1000.00 per annum to commence October 1st 1881. Which call was accepted. General meetings of the church and Society were held at the residence of C.E. Resseguie and it was decided to rebuild the church."
